Preliminary Background Check – (Association office handles this.)		
<b>Once the above have been received, applicant meets with working group. registrar notifies chair and staff person. then provides instructions to the candidate about the following on go-ahead from the working group.</b>		
Interview with Discernment Working Group – MiD Status granted or not, pending Psychological Assessment		
Psychological Assessment completed. Received and reviewed by Working Group. (Association Office will share instructions)		
Member-in-Discernment receives letter confirming MiD status.		
Advisor assigned. Community of Practice Group assigned.		
CPE and Field Placement/internship under supervision outside of home parish		
Plan of Formation, start on 2 <sup>nd</sup> year of Seminary or NEOSOM		
Engagement with wider church – General Synod, Association or Conference Gatherings...		
Plan or Formation submitted. Interview scheduled.		
Ordination Paper written and submitted – Interview scheduled		
Ordination Paper and Worship presented to Committee in Ministry
