The Association Annual Meeting 2020 held via zoom on November 7 with Bishop Yvette Flunder as our preacher was inspiring and meaningful and well attended. 205 registered to attend. 170 attended with 83 authorized ministers, 32 lay delegates, 55 guest participants all representing 82 of our congregations. Deepest thanks to Moderator Steven Savides for his expert leadership.

During annual meeting I suggested that since we are living in times when the issues we face are not problems with prescribed solutions our calling can be expressed in the following three words:
