READINESS ASSESSMENT FOR CHURCH CLOSURE

Is your church a good candidate for closure?

Take the survey then score your church's candidacy for closure using a scale of 1 to 5. (1=no, not at all, 5=yes, strongly so). Estimate your score on each of the questions below, add up the tally. The higher your total, the stronger your church is nearing closure.

- 1. Preserving the past is more attractive than visioning the future
- 2. There is no real sense of mission and purpose
- 3. Church cares more about itself than the people it is called to reach
- 4. The money is inwardly focused, not tied to the mission. Funds are expended to keep the lights on and/or to meet the preferences of the members
- 5. There has been a numerical decline for four or more years
- 6. The church does not look like the community in which it is located
- 7. The congregation is mostly comprised of senior adults
- 8. The focus is on the past, not the future
- 9. The members are intensely preference-driven more concerned about their music style, their programs, their facilities than reaching others with God's love
- 10. There are sacred cows that are held tightly
- 11. Any type of change is met with fierce resistance
- 12. Members are tired and have no energy for continued mission
- 13. Members are frustrated with younger generations

Remember, closure is not the end. With closing the church purposefully the church can gift and leave a legacy to benefit the community and the world, becoming a resurrection church as its ministry is reborn in a new way.
