published 10 books, on history, Ethiopian proverbs and about ministry. He lived out his ministry for the rest of his days, showing love to all whom he encountered.





Rev. Paul Kiewit died September 6, 2022. He graduated from Heidelberg University, where he met his wife, Dorothy. They were married upon his graduation from Eden Theological Seminary on November 9, 1946. He began his ministry in the United Church of Christ on the staff of St. John's Church, Columbus, and then served other Ohio congregations in Canal Winchester, Massillon, Akron, and Canton, retiring as Senior Pastor of Trinity United Church of Christ after a 16-year tenure. Paul had a significant pastoral ministry. He was a member and officer of the founding board of Planned Parenthood in Akron and a trustee of Heidelberg

University. He was a member of the United Church Homes Board, serving as chair for three years. Active in the UCC's Living Water Association, he served as Secretary and Moderator; and within the Heartland Conference of the UCC he was on the Board of Trustees and headed its Finance and Investment committees.
