While often used in product design, JTBD interviews can be a great tool for congregations to focus on understanding the underlying motivations and needs of individuals, aiming to uncover the "job" or purpose they are trying to fulfill in a particular context. Using JTBD interviews can provide a structured framework for exploring not just what individuals do, but why they do it, helping to reveal deeper insights into their aspirations, challenges, and desires within the community. This approach provides a structured framework for building mutual knowledge and gaining a nuanced understanding of the diverse perspectives within the congregation.

4. Personal Stories:


 Anecdotes and narratives that provide depth to the understanding of community needs.
